Our lives here seem to sustain a certain level of chaos. Every Spring Break

We built a new home for Lorenza, her daughter Evelin, and her son-in-law Cesar. Lorenza is the sweetest lady. She has suffered through many health issues through the years, including having to be resuscitated on three separate occations due to heart attacks. It was an incredible time of getting reacquainted and getting to know all of the super fun Natchitocians. Though we had to fight incredible winds in the vast open desert, we were able to finish the house for Ricardo & his family. We didn't get to meet his wife, Itzel, because she was in the hospital about to have their third child. Ricardo and his family are not followers of Christ, so please pray with us that this astonishing gift of a new home and child and being introduced to a local community of believers will be a great witness to their lives.

My final build of the Spring Break season was with St. Peter's Episcopal of Milford, Conneticut. St. Peter's has been faithfully serving families in Juárez since 2008, but this was their first time to build with Casas. Even though I had a bit of a rough week with the extremely difficult site, my bad back, and the fatigue of my crazy schedule, it was an amazing week. Though difficult, the site was beautiful, overlooking downtown Juárez and El Paso. Graciela and her familiy are very involved in their church and community through their work at a food kitchen. Last August the contract on our home in Mount Carmel fell through. As a result, we scrambled to put our home back on the market, and we had to increase our paychecks in order to help offset the cost of covering both our mortgage in Mt. Carmel and our rent in El Paso. Our budget has been really tight since then. We spent the last eight months praying for God to find us a buyer. Well, He finally did, and just in the nick of time, too. We had to lower our paychecks substantially in the beginning of April because we had drained the entire surplus that we had accumulated in our support account. The new buyers moved in already, which means we should still be able to pay all of our bills even with the lower paycheck amount. Yay! We are still currently withdrawing a few hundred more each month from our support account than we are bringing in. With a new baby on the way, I'm sure our budget will need to stretch even further.
